
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE March 2021 COUNCIL MEETING


- Holy Week Services have been scheduled and plans to advertise to the surrounding neighborhood are being made.
- Pastor Tim will do a pulpit exchange with Pastor Mark Friedrich every 8 to 10 weeks.
- Pastor Tim would like to start a mid week Bible class.
- Pastor Tim has had revitalization talks with several pastors and asked for volunteers to serve on a committee.
- Treasurer reported a positive balance at the end of February of \$156 and a year-todate positive balance of \$950. Two or three volunteers needed to audit the books.
- Board of Finance obtained and reviewed three bids for liability, umbrella and workers comp insurance. The Board recommends the bid from Church Mutual for Council and Voters approval.
- Board of Stewardship reported an \$8000 donation from the Foundation that donated \$3100 last year for the homeless students at Tempe High. This year their donation will also support students at Gililland and Holdeman as well as Tempe High.
- Donations for Justa Center were collected in March.
- Board of Christian Education met with Pastor Tim to discuss topics for Sunday School and Bible classes by looking at our church with 'new eyes'. Suggested giving chocolate crosses to children at both Easter Services.
- Easter Services will be at 8 AM and 10 AM. A continental breakfast will be served.
- Members volunteered 50 hours of their time as musicians and for doing tasks around the church property.
- Bathroom remodel will begin after Easter.
- Will replace basketball hoops and hold a ribbon cutting ceremony to encourage use by the neighborhood.
- GLORIA worship team met and planned services for March and April.
- 50 Gospel Easter baskets were assembled for Sharon Owens and her international students at ASU. Mountain View also assembled the other 50 baskets Sharon requested as well as 50 dozen Gospel egg cartons.
- PTC will provide live flowers for the Easter Sunday worship service that members and guests can take home.
- Next Council meeting is April 20th.
- Quarterly Voters meeting is April 25th.



LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE (LWML) ALSO KNOWN AS WOMEN IN MISSION As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others. Thanks to everyone for your support of the Gospel Easter Basket project for Sharon Owens and her international students at ASU. We assembled 50 baskets. Mountain View assembled 50 baskets and 50 dozen cartons of Gospel Easter eggs. Sharon will be distributing these Maundy Thursday. She currently has two Thursday sessions of lessons and sharing. 35 students can attend each session. Instead of eating together, ASU dictates food must be prepackaged and taken home. Gethsemane will be providing meals on three Thursdays this month.

Sharon uses the contents of the baskets to tell the Gospel:

- The woven basket symbolizes the crown of thorns on Jesus' head.
- The grass reminds of us of Jesus in the hay in the manger.
- A bag of chocolate coins is used to show the betrayal of Jesus.
- The chocolate cross symbolizes the death on the cross of our Savior.
- An empty plastic egg reflects the empty tomb.
- The peeps symbolize people.
- Chocolate foil-covered Easter eggs represent the shiny streets of gold in heaven where Jesus is.
- Jellybeans and a Jelly Bea n Prayer explaining the meaning of the colors are used to share the Easter story with another person.

The National LWML Convention will be held in person in Lexington, KY June 24-26. The District will host a Retreat in Las Vegas, Oct. 3-5. If you are interested in either event, please let me know.

We plan to resume in-person meetings of our society at Beautiful Savior in September.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT:

The Stewardship Committee's biggest project right now is to help fill the Gililland Food Pantry. Our contact there has given us a list of items needed (which we passed on to the congregation in February and you helped provide.) We watch for ads during the month and if anything on that list goes on sale, we take advantage of those sales but we do most of the shopping at Fry's on Senior Wednesday and take advantage of getting 10% off. We have done this in February and March and will probably continue in April and May depending on their needs. We don't know whether or not the food pantry is open in the summer months.

Our committee was stunned by a donation we received to be used mostly for Tempe High School McKinney Vento program (homeless kids) but can be used to aid Holdeman and Gililland schools as well. Last year, this donor gave us \$3,100 to help the Tempe High kids and we provided clothes and school supplies for them and funded their Angel Tree for gifts to these kids at Christmas. This year the same donor gave us \$8,000.00 to use, again, mainly for Tempe High but we can use for the other 2 schools at our discretion. Join us in praising God for this generous donor!!!

March was the month that we collected for the Justa Center, the facility for homeless seniors located in Phoenix. That money will either be given to them directly for them to use as they see fit or we may shop for supplies for them.
