¹In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

The Service of Light

THE PASSING OF THE LIGHT OF CHRIST

At the Beginning of the Service of Light the Sanctuary will be darkened as we focus in on the light of Christ.

P: Darkness in 1st century Israel was something they believed had to be overcome; and for them it wasn't easy: the few torches and candles they had didn't go far to illuminate their nights. Now, for us it's as simple as "let there be light." Nobody is going to drive home this evening without their

path being illuminated, and as you head out after church most of the homes you pass will be bright with Christmas lights. But there is a lot of darkness in our world: spiritual darkness, moral darkness, ethical darkness. The scope of the darkness around us is almost impossible to comprehend. We are living in a world of darkness, on a “cold winter’s night that was so deep.” Friends in Christ, the world needs LIGHT. I need light. You need light. And we know people, lots of people who need light as well. For this reason, LIGHT has come into the world, and that is why we are here this evening: because Christ IS the Light who has come into the world, a light that shines into every nook and cranny of creation and onto every human created in the image of God! Tonight, it all begins with one light, the Christ Candle, that candle that symbolizes the end of the waiting and the celebration of Christ’s coming. That one light will become two, then four, then eight, then sixteen and on and on until the entire church is glowing with the light of Christ.

(At this time, everyone is invited to “light their candle and sing.)
