Hope Doesn't Let The Story End!

AS WE GATHER

The Apostle Paul dwells on a central meditation of Lent here in our reading today from Romans. Verse 7 begins his inspired reflection on God's motive to send the Son to the holy cross: "One will scarcely die for a righteous person, though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die." There is only one thing which will lead a person to do such a thing — *love*. As Jesus Himself said, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends." Yes, for his friends, but who would lay down his life for his enemies? That is the depth of God's divine love for us: "While we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son." Yes, "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Yes, Us, All of us. For Jews, For Samaritan Women, and even for people like us. Christ did this for us. That is the unique love of God. Where does it come from? It has nothing to do with the qualities of the person who is loved, Romans 3 makes that clear. It simply comes from God Himself. It is internal to His nature, who and what He is.
