April 23 (After Worship Service)Election of Officers & Board Member Voters Meeting

All voting members are eligible to hold office, except as prohibited by the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. For all open positions, nominations from the floor at the April Voters meeting will be accepted. The voting member making the nomination from the floor must have obtained the nominees agreement to serve.

President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Voters Assembly and the Church Council and shall see to it that all things are done in a Christian way in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws.

Secretary.

Takes the minutes of all Voters Assembly and Church Council meetings. Keeps accurate records of the voting membership and attendance at meetings. Creates the agenda for all Voters Assembly and Council meetings. Draws up and signs the official legal papers and documents and executes all correspondence.

Board of Trustees.

Responsible for the upkeep, maintenance, and improvement of the property of the congregation.

Board of Christian Education.

Advances the cause of Christian Education in the Congregation. Supervises the organization and operation of the Christian educational activities for the congregation including Sunday School classes, Vacation Bible School and other Christian education opportunities.

Board of Stewardship.

Promotes Christian stewardship within the congregation and community by encouraging regular and proportional giving of time, talent, and treasure.

Board of Finance.

Works to create a good system in financial affairs and for the elimination of debts of the congregation. Works with the Board of Stewardship to enlist the financial support of all members of the congregation. Responsible for the counting, recording, and depositing all monies received. Creates an estimated budget for consideration at the November meeting of the Voters Assembly.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MARCH 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

"Serving the Lord, extending the gospel, and making Jesus alive in the community."

The regular Council meeting was held March 20th. Highlights of that meeting are:

- Pastor Tim gave thankful recognition of Music Director Ellen Brown for her work on the Installation music as well as writing a hymn verse capturing President Gibson's message. 97 were in attendance and \$470 was raised for Mission Outreach in the Pacific Southwest District.
- Holy week activities will include a joint event with La Mesa Maundy Thursday. This will include foot washing, dinner, holy communion, and Psalm 22. Please bring hygiene items for La Mesa by this date.
- Baking of communion bread and egg stuffing scheduled for Monday, April 3, 5 PM
- Forward in 23 (formerly called Revitalization) has met twice during Lent:
 - o Planning every member visit
 - Looking to launch a new community minded program
 - Health minded ministry ideas
 - Internal discipleship opportunities
 - Women's Bible studies to begin week of April 10th
 - o ESL class, probably in the fall
 - Maybe a Counseling center
 - Pastor has contacted Tempe Chamber of Commerce about benefits of membership.
 Council voted to approve a one year membership to the Chamber to learn how Beautiful Savior can serve the community.
 - Pastor met with Gethsemane's community connection coordinator and will meet with St. Luke's coordinator.
- Would like to recognize 1 year anniversary of partnership with La Mesa at the end of this month by hosting a dinner for them. They have had 70+ in attendance each week.
- Treasurer reported a positive balance at the end of February of \$1,063.
- The Elders were asked to review the Missions Beautiful Savior supports (SOLA at ASU, Campus Ministry Coalition at ASU, Camp ALOMA, Friends' House at Drake Park, Lutheran Indian Ministries, Pacific SW District LCMS).
- Stewardship raised \$500 for Justa Center during their February drive.
- Stewardship is working with Scales, Holdeman and Mosley schools on their wish lists for this year.
- Board of Christian Ed members are Pastor Tim, Debby Bergman, Charles Haynes, Darlene Haynes, Phyllis Schinke, and Gladys Meyer.
 - Topics discussed: Christian Education, Women's Bible Study, ESL- English Seconded Language, Vacation Bible School, New Member Class, Men's Group, and Young Adult / College.
 - Weekly Women's Bible Study to begin April 10th, meeting Mondays and Fridays to study Women in the Bible
 - VBS June 26-30, 5-7:30 PM. Theme is 'Twists and Turns'.
- Elders will add the common cup to Holy Communion beginning Easter Sunday.
- Trustees reported 25 volunteer hours. Thanks to everyone who has helped with the weekly cleaning.
- Trustees reported 2 air conditioners have been installed; two more to be installed by end of March. The large unit for the sanctuary is on order.

- Trustees will purchase a new large size wheel chair.
- Musicians volunteered 93 hours during March.
- Next GLORIA meeting is April 24th, 10 AM.
- Please tell Director Ellen if you would be interested in playing handbells! She would like to reactivate that part of the music program.
- LWML plans to meet Saturday, April 22nd at 10 AM at Beautiful Savior. That's Earth Day!




OLD PRINTER CARTRIDGES



STEWARDSHIP REPORT

April, 2023, Newsletter Report

Stewardship Committee

On Monday, March 20th, we delivered 20 backpacks to Tempe High McKinney Vento program. We ordered a more expensive bag and are hoping these will wear better than the ones we previously ordered from a bulk website. On that day, we were given a list by Veronica of school supplies and hygiene products that they needed. Consequently, we delivered folders, mechanical pencils, pencil pouches, shampoo, lotion, toothpaste, and hair brushes to her on Friday, March 28th.

Pastor Tim, Bobbie and Charlotte met and decided that it would be fair for the schools to know the dollar amount of what they can expect from us during the year of 2023. Knowing what they have to work with should help them set priorities. We are setting aside about half of the grant (\$8000) for Tempe High MV and divide the rest between the 3 other schools. It will be about \$2,900 for each school.

We have given Holdeman School prepaid VISA debit cards to be used for purchasing eyeglasses for their students totaling \$400. We also gave that school a prepaid VISA card in the amount of \$300 to be used to purchase shoes for students. We took delivery of the 35 pair of leggings that we had ordered and that the girls wear and took them to the school early in March.

Scales school received a \$300 prepaid VISA card for starting up their eyeglass program. They need uniforms (polo shirts and shorts,) shoes, and playground items---such as basketballs, kick balls, etc. We are waiting for them to get back to us with how many of each thing they want.

We have not been able to connect with anyone at Mosely but we left another message on Friday, March 24th, telling them what their share of the grant is and asking them to contact us if they need something.

- 5. Search for Beautiful Savior by name and click 'Save'.



Pastor Tim Anderson:

Take Your Holy Days Not Just Your Holidays.

For fear of sounding redundant, I have been thinking a lot over the last couple of days about those words which a mentor, teacher and friend once spoke to me. He said that when it comes to Holy Week, when it comes to Easter, as pastors we are to encourage the church to take their Holy Days not just their holidays. Now what he meant was this, that as much as it is needed, necessary, and nice to find times of rest, that there is more to rest then just vacation. There is more to rest then just time to get away that is if you can afford it. True rest is found in the ability to worship the one who gives us rest in this life and in the next. True Rest is found in Jesus. As Jesus himself once said,

²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30 ESV)

Rest for our souls found in the yoke of Jesus. What an awesome, crazy and yet beautiful idea. Notice though that rest comes with a yoke, which really doesn't sound all that restful. Let's take a look at it again.

³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30 ESV)

Now a yoke is a wooden crosspiece fastened over the necks of two animals and attached to a plow or cart. A yoke allows two animals to share a load and pull together. Yokes were used in

Bible times primarily with bulls or oxen to plow fields and pull wagons. The animals yoked together needed to be close in size and weight for the cart or plow to pull evenly.

Close in size and weight to pull evenly, now that's funny. I know I'm a big dude, and yet as I find my rest in Jesus, he carries the weight. What I see is that this isn't evenly carried at all, in fact all the weight of the crossbeam is laid on Jesus. It is laid on Him as He is lifted up on that crossbeam to die for your sake and mine. It was our sin that held him there. He carries that, willingly. And in the reality of what he willingly does for us, you and I can find rest.

So, come find rest again, in His dying breath that brings us life. Come and experience once again the rest that comes through your Lord's death and resurrection. Take your Holy Days. Take them, come here and see once again, the 24 hours that lead to a moment where a single word changes the relationship between God and us forever.

Hear Him once again create a new covenant meal with us, hear Him once again pray for us in the garden, hear Him again get up on that cross for us, and hear Him again speak that single word Tetelestai, it is finished, for us. He says it for us, yes, it is also for the whole world, but it is uniquely and especially for you, so that you might find rest in him.

And gosh, do I need that. I need the rest and the promise of rest that can come only from this. I think maybe that is why I enjoy Easter so much. I think that's why I always want to celebrate in bigger and bigger ways. More work for the sake of rest? Pastor Tim that's nuts. Yes, it is, but it is still the reason we provide what we provide, because nothing else gives us this peace, this hope, this rest and the life that Holy Week provides. Nothing gives us life like the yoke of Jesus, the crossbeam on which he died to give us life. Rest comes in boldly proclaiming that in Jesus we find our rest. That in his death and resurrection, the father now looks at Him as he considers us, and gives us eternal life and rest, rest from this weary and broken world. One day, that rest is all we will know.

So, come find rest with us, even if it seems busy this Holy Week at Beautiful Savior. Come find rest as the beauty of who he is and what he has done gives us a hope, a peace and a rest the world cannot know and has not known. No vacation can give you the peace, the stillness, the rest, and the hope that we find on Easter morning when the tomb is empty. Nothing can give us that rest like when we hear Jesus calling Mary by her name, or as we see Peter and John run to the tomb. Nothing can give us rest like the disciples' anxiety being met by and overcome by Jesus' friendly greeting of, "Peace be with you."

This Holy Week, come, find your rest as the same peace comes to you. Come be reminded of the new realities found in him. In the new realities of a meal shared together, where betrayer and denier are still both welcomed, come to the cross, see family created, all people forgiven, and hope proclaimed by the one dying for our sake. come Saturday for a hopeful and peaceful Easter

Vigil as the story of salvation leads us again to the empty tomb. And join us on Easter Sunday, to hear that Death has been defeated, it no longer has power over us.

Take your Holy Days and take your Holidays, because both provide you rest. Both recenter us, just in different ways. Holy week is what this whole Christian Faith thing is about. It is the heart of our faith and identity. My prayer is that it will once again center us in the hope we have. My prayer is that in the resurrection, we might find rest for our souls and a trust in the one who carries us along the way to the day when he calls us to our eternal rest in him.

We worship Holy Week at the following times

Palm Sunday: 10am

Maundy Thursday: 12pm and 6pm

Good Friday: 3pm and 7pm

Holy Saturday: 7pm

Easter Sunday: 8am and 10am.

See you this Holy Week.

Pastor Tim
