On The Road to Emmaus

AS WE GATHER

The Gospel of Luke is full of stories of people going to Jerusalem and back home, we see Mary and Joseph go after Jesus' birth, they are there in Jerusalem when Jesus is twelve and stays behind, and we know that during his ministry Jesus traveled often to Jerusalem. Each time through, they went home. In today's gospel reading, two more are going home, Cleopas and his companion. But they are pulled back to Jerusalem by the resurrected lord who reveals Scripture to them On The Way, and reveals himself as they welcome him in and he breaks bread in their midst. He sends them back to Jerusalem and gets them ready to go out again. Even today, we live our lives on the way, going to all sorts of places, maybe even with hopes crushed, But Jesus comes and reveals the promises of scripture to us again and again, even when we don't recognize him. He then Reveals himself to us as we break bread, and hear the words, my body, my blood. As we do, we as the church regroup, we encourage, we support, and we go back out onto the road again, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

They were at the tomb early in the morning, ²³ and when they did not find his body, they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. ²⁴Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see." ²⁵And he said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" ²⁷And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.

²⁸So they drew near to the village to which they were going. He acted as if he were going farther, ²⁹but they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent." So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. ³¹And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. And he vanished from their sight. ³²They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the Scriptures?" ³³And they rose that same hour and returned to Jerusalem. And they found the eleven and those who were with them gathered together, ³⁴saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!" ³⁵Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he was known to them in the breaking of the bread.
