HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SEPTEMBER 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

The regular monthly Council meeting was held September 18th. Highlights of that meeting are:

Pastor Report:

- Reviewed the status of the 4 Christian Education opportunities available. We have added a new Bible Study opportunity each year for the past three years.
- Pastor reported on the Sept. 8th meeting of Faith Partners/Tempe School District with Dr. James Driscoll, Superintendent, and Michele Grimaldi, Wraparound Services. Beautiful Savior was one of 5 churches invited to join this committee.
 - The 5 churches described how they have served their neighbor schools.
 - Dr. Driscoll stated he wants the relationship with the district to be a partnership and not an us-ship. The schools want to be in a position to help us.
 - One need is for Emergency Response sites for things like power outages, A/C failures, active shooter situations, and more.

- Attended the LWML Zone Executive Committee meeting at Eternal Life as the newly appointed Zone Counselor replacing Pastor Spallek.
- Mosley would like to continue using our field through December for the softball team.
- Future opportunities for service include a discussion with Gretchen about providing pastoral care to members of touring companies. Pastor will be providing care to Gretchen's team when the Foo Fighters are in town Oct. 3rd.
- Pastoral Leadership Institute training for Pastor and Annie will be Oct. 26-28 at Concordia Irvine.
- Don Schumm, Cyndi Calender, and Pastor Tim will attend the Gatherers, Shepherds, and Elders training Monday Oct. 16th at Gethsemane being offered free of charge by the Pacific Southwest District of the LCMS.
- La Mesa has delivered a large supply of paper towels and toilet paper to be used by both BSLC and La Mesa. A supply of peanut butter and jelly used by BSLC to prepare the weekly sack luncheons was also delivered. These supplies came from the La Mesa ingathering held Sept. 9th. Four BSLC members helped with the sorting of that ingathering at Christ Greenfield.
- Upcoming events include the Fish Fry, Fall Festival & Trunk or Treat, and the Caledonian Games.
- Pat Carlin is no longer employed by BSLC to clean the facility. If you have concerns or questions, please talk to pastor.

Financials:

- Total cash on hand was \$124,629 as of August 31, 2023. Fund balances are:
 - o LCEF Savings \$71,995.76
 - Wells Fargo savings \$17,330.28
 - Wells Fargo checking \$35,303.29
- August ended with a negative balance of (\$2,151).
- Year-to-date income/expense balance at the end of August is a negative (\$967).
- Year-to-date expenses were 93% of budget. Year-to-date income was 92.2% of budget.
- Working on the transfer of accounts from Wells Fargo to Desert Financial.
- Budget cycle will begin in October.

Stewardship:

- \$585 collected from the congregation in August for the Justa Center. Supplies have been purchased and delivered to them.
- Hygiene items and snacks for weekend backpacks purchased and delivered to Tempe High for the McKinney Vento students.
- \$200 prepaid VISA card given to Holdeman to purchase eyeglasses. A Holdeman teacher who also works at Walmart was reimbursed \$80 for the 20 pairs of shoes she purchased for the students. They have started a pre-school and requested underwear for the students which has been purchased and delivered to them. They have also requested skorts and dresses which will be ordered and delivered to them.
- Mosley used the last of their allotment for snack sized candy for a specialist teacher to give out to the students as rewards for hard work.
- Waiting to hear from Scales about their needs.

- Next meeting is October 1st.

Board of Trustees:

• 91 volunteer hours

- Braille printer electrical work is done.
- Trees on south lawn have been taken down. Sails will be replaced.

- Question about stripping and finishing fellowship hall floor.

Music Ministry:

- The next GLORIA meeting will be Nov. 6th, 10 AM.
- Donna Evans, leader of the Braille team, and Music Dir. Ellen are actively working on the set-up, organization, and refurbishment of the new Braille + Music Room. A contest is being initiated to re-name the room.
- The Organ Stop Pizza Event was attended by 22 members and guests.
- Jana Shields provided music for the Sept. 3rd worship service and gave a presentation during fellowship hour.
- The Grand Legacy of Faith celebrated during fellowship hour Sept. 10th was successful, meaningful, and fun! This could be an annual event.
- Suggest doing a themed Sunday in January, 2024, on "The Bible," inviting members to bring their Bibles and share stories about them during Fellowship.
- New Handbell Choir Director Wendy Sievers is working on ideas for the Handbell Choir's Fall Season repertoire and schedule.
- Painting and door replacement will be included in the upgrade of the Music and Braille room don't forget to enter the name contest for this new space!

The congregation raised \$585 in the month of August for the Justa Center. We did our shopping at Costco and Smart and Final to buy them the items they needed and delivered them on September 15. \$70 additional has come in in September so we will wait till November and then see if there is anything we can do to help them at Thanksgiving.

Tempe High MV program is in need of food items for weekend backpacks and we will deliver that to them after their Fall break. They also need 50 tote bags for their students.

Holdeman now has a pre-school so they asked for boys and girls underwear in very small sizes. They also needed some skorts and dresses for little girls as well. They have been ordered and will be delivered after Fall break. They have used up their prepaid VISA card for eyeglasses so we need to provide a new one. An anonymous donor from the congregation wants to use \$100 of their loved ones' memorial to fund a card for eyeglasses so we will do that. A Holdeman teacher who also works at

Walmart grabbed 20 pair of shoes that were going to the sales table at a cost of \$80 so we reimbursed her for her expenditure.

Mosely used up their allotment with candy that a specialist teacher uses as rewards for her students.

We have contacted Scales School and are waiting to hear back,

WHAT IS LWML SUNDAY?

Traditionally, the first Sunday in October is set aside for the observation of LWML Sunday, but it may be celebrated at any time. Here are some interesting facts, according to the LWML history book, 'Women IN God's Service, WINGS'.

During the 12th Biennial Convention in Washington, D.C., July 18-20, 1967 (Eula Hankel, President), a resolution was passed designating the first Sunday in October as LWML Sunday. On Sunday, October 1, 1967, the first LWML Sunday was held. A letter to all pastors and societies was released to explain that "LWML Sunday was to be a window through which could be seen the marvelous opportunities the Lord gives the women of the church to be in mission and serve in His Name." Pastors were asked to have a prayer for LWML, and some prayer thoughts were included.

In 1968 an informational brochure, *Serve the Lord with Gladness,* was produced as part of LWML Sunday.

In 1973, three-fourths of all societies observed LWML Sunday.

Beginning in 1975, bulletin covers were distributed for LWML Sunday and in 1976, a children's activity page was added to LWML Sunday resources.

Pastor Tim Anderson:

It's No Trick, The Sweetness Of The Gospel Is Really A Treat.

3 And he said to me, "Son of man, eat whatever you find here. Eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." ² So I opened my mouth, and he gave me this scroll to eat. ³ And he said to me, "Son of man, feed your belly with this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and it was in my mouth as sweet as honey.

October is always a great month for us here at Beautiful Savior and as we get to the last three months of the year. In many ways, October begins a new ministry season that will continue to and through the new year all the way even to next spring. We once again begin sharing the story of who Jesus is, what he has come to do, and what that means for us all. To "tell the Old, Old Story of Jesus and His love."



As we get ready to do that once again, we celebrate the sweetness of the Gospel this month as we get ready once again to host our fall festival and our fish fry. Two events that seem maybe unconnected but in reality, do the same thing... they point us to the one who comes and feed his people with more than Fish and Bread, and with more than Gummi Bears and Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, but who feeds us with his very word. Who feeds us with his very body and blood as that word, the word of God takes on flesh. And that word is so, so sweet.

We see the sweetness of God's word in the calling of Ezekiel. Now Ezekiel did not have an easy ministry. He was called by God to challenge the People of God and tell them about the coming destruction of their nation and the captivity to come. His words were filled with a lot of bitter law, but the sweetness of the word of God was found in the sweetness of His promises, promises that remain true to us regardless of the times around us. Regardless of when we might even need to speak tough words to friends, neighbors, even to the people of God here at church, the sweetness of God's promise is that it remains true to all of us, regardless of our broken

circumstances, and that same good news is offered to all. What a beautiful thing to see how God provides for all and looks at every single human being as someone worth dying for.

I mean let's talk fish for a minute. Jesus feeds two huge crowds a very similar meal... fish. He does it once with a crowd that we assume was primarily Jewish and he does it again with a crowd that we assume was gentile, made up of all the nations around the lands of Judah. The same gift and the same meal offered to both, a meal that leaves you full and has left overs.



And time and again, Jesus shows that this sweet message is for all people and its free. You don't even have to ring a door bell, knock on a door, or walk up to a car trunk, the sweetness of the Gospel is extended to

you all from the cross. And that message, sweet as sugar, is the message that a monk in 1517 would post on a church door on Oct 31st. Luther starts the reformation with the thought of returning the church back to the proclamation of the sweetness of God's message, in all its truth, both law and gospel, for all. There is no trick here, in Christ we are treated to the sweetness of belonging, the sweetness of hope, and the sweetness of life.

Join us this month as we share that sweetness with others. Join us as we feed our neighbors and community and show them that they are loved just as much as we are by a God who sweetly feeds and nourishes us all, as he points us back to him. How sweet it is to be loved by Him. To all be loved by Him. Amen.
