HIGHLIGHTS OF THE OCTOBER 2023 VOTERS AND COUNCIL MEETINGS

The regular monthly Council meeting was held October 17th. The Quarterly Voters meeting was held October 22nd. Highlights of those meetings are:

Pastor Report:

- Attended the Pacific Southwest District Pastors' Conference and learned the following:
 - State of our Synod Report: 20% of LCMS congregations now worship less then 30 people per Sunday.
 - New District Staff Position: Rev. Jim Henkel was brought onto the district staff to serve as the Ministry director.
 - Simple things churches can be engaged in to create new ministry opportunities for those inside the church and outside the church. One huge ministry program that we already have is Lutheran Braille Workers. Pres. Gibson encouraged each church to consider starting this cheap, effective, and easily approachable ministry, and BSLC was celebrated for already having a chapter.
- Thanked the Calenders for their leadership of The Chosen night in my absence and Sandra Wardwell for leading the Women's Bible Study on Mondays.
- Our relationship with Tempe schools continues to grow. I attended a meeting at the Tempe School District with other faith leaders to share ways we assist our nearby schools. The Mosley students are using our field for softball practice. Our LWM members sent letters of appreciation to the staff at Holdeman. We will write to Mosley staff next and will ask BSLC members to help. A pen pal program has begun with three 6th grade Mosley students.
- I invited Mary Ellen Wood (Interior Designer & Pastor's wife of Shepherd of the Canyon, Gold Canyon AZ) to visit BSLC to assess our spaces and give our trustees a few ideas on ways to optimize storage, declutter, and freshen up our space while still holding to the look and feel of BSLC.
- Tempe Fire Dept. will be using our parking lot Saturday, Nov. 4, 2023, 7:30 to noon for their volunteers who will be giving out Free Smoke Alarms in the neighborhood. Skip McFadden has volunteered to be at the church during this time as volunteers will need access to rest rooms. Additional BSLC members volunteering to be present that morning are welcome.
- Caledonian Society will be returning to BSLC field for their Highland Games on Veteran's Day Sunday. We will host worship outside that day and members will be invited to stay for a grill out lunch and to watch and support the games.
- I met with Gretchen Adickes to discuss ways of providing spiritual support to staff touring with entertainment groups since they are away from their home churches, family, and support groups. One idea is to create an online database of local churches in the areas they visit that would be open to providing spiritual support to them.
- Gatherers/Shepherds/Elders Training Team: Don Schumm and Cyndi Calender were with me Monday Oct. 16th for the first session of GSE, (Gatherers, Shepherds and Elders) a training being offered to us by the District.

President's Report:

- Please reset air conditioners in Fellowship Hall and south side classrooms to 84 degrees when
 you are finished using those rooms. Do not turn the A/C off; just reset to a higher temperature
 when no one is using those rooms.
- Fall Festival:
 - Volunteers need to help with games and wherever needed. Please be at the church at 2 PM to help with set up.

- Debbie O'Neill has arranged for hot dogs, cotton candy, cokes, popcorn to be donated by the Cardinals.

- Thanks to Pastor Tim, Ellen, and Marsha in recognition of Church Worker Appreciation Day.

Financials:

- Account Funds as of Sept. 30, 2023:
 - LCEF Savings \$72,031.51
 - Wells Fargo Savings (Matching Funds) \$17,332.41
 - Wells Fargo Checking \$29,378.42
- Designated Funds total \$21,258.29 of the Checking Account
- July-Sept 2023 Profit & Loss report shows a negative balance of \$4,915.01. Expenses were 92.3% of budget; income was 81.4% of budget.
- January September 2023 Profit & Loss report shows a negative balance of \$5,287.10.
 Expenses were 93.3% of budget; income was 89.4% of budget.

Financial highlights of 3Q23:

- We are in the process of moving our Wells Fargo checking and savings accounts to Desert Financial Credit Union.
- The 2024 budget cycle has started. Worksheets should be returned to the treasurer by November 12th.
- Discussed budgeting for special events such as VBS, Fish Fry, and the Fall Festival. We should have a good idea of what our costs should be BEFORE the event, so people know how much they are allowed to spend and we can identify funding sources.
- The Kitchen / Fellowship fund had a positive balance of \$277 at the end of June.
- Contribution envelopes have been received and will be distributed in December.
- Jim Timm passed out the 3rd Quarter Giving Report
- EasyTithe is available for electronic giving. Current categories are General Fund, Missions, LWML, Air Conditioners, La Mesa, and Staff Continuing Education. Anyone can donate electronically by going to www.EasyTithe.com/BSLCTempe.

Stewardship:

- \$585 collected from the congregation in August for the Justa Center. Supplies have been purchased and delivered to them.
- A BSLC member donated \$100 for a prepaid Visa card to support the eyeglass program at Holdeman school. Pictures of students with their eyeglasses are on the bulletin board in the narthex.
- Will be working on the Angel Tree program at Tempe High for McKinney Vento students.
- Stewardship drive has begun. Stewardship Sunday will be Nov. 19th.

Board of Christian Education:

 Will be starting on next year's VBS program by determining if we will partner with Church on Mill and Gethsemane.

Board of Elders/Evangelism:

- Fish fry raised \$1585 and was attended by 80 people.
- May consider moving Fish Fry to spring.
- Will meet with Altar committee.

Board of Trustees:

- Don Schumm finished making a cabinet out of the ends of the bookcase in the fellowship hall. It is recommended for use as additional storage for kitchen supplies.
- Our members continue to be generous with their time: 295 volunteer hours from mid-July to mid-October.
- New refrigerator purchased for southside kitchen area.
- New electrical work installed in choir room for the new Braille printer. Braille work area will be moved into the choir room.
- Reset A/C units to 84 degrees when finished using the Fellowship hall and the south side meeting rooms. Do not turn off; just reset to a higher temperature so units are not coming on as often.
- Reminder to be sure glass front doors are completely closed when you exit the building.

Music Ministry:

- Thanks to our talented singers!
- GLORIA meeting Nov. 6th. We are incorporating more contemporary music into the worship services.
- Organ Stop Pizza event in September was attended by 22 BSLC members.
- Wendy Sievers has volunteered to be our Handbell Choir Director. Cyndi and Ellen attended a bell choir workshop Oct. 21st. The bell choir will rehearse Saturday, Nov. 4th, 10:30 AM.
- The choir room is being re-organized to accommodate the Braille workers. Anyone interested in having the desk, please contact Ellen Brown. There are also several blue hymnals to be given away. NEEDED: 2 4-drawer letter size file cabinets. Watch for the contest to rename that area to reflect both music and Braille activities.

August meal attendance: 436, worship attendance: 124 (5 Thursdays this month!)


September meal attendance: 380, worship attendance: 88


October meal attendance: 382, worship attendance: 90


The highest attendance was recorded October 26th with 111 people! These four months averaged 90 people per Thursday.

Pastor Tim Anderson:

Another Complicated Saint.

The other day I got news that a former professor of mine, Rev. Gerry Coleman had passed away. Gerry was a giant in the Lutheran Church. He was a teacher, pastor, musician, and composer and impacted many people for the Lord, even everyone here at Beautiful Savior. Next Sunday, grab a hymnal (The LSB) and turn to Hymn 547.

The Lamb was written by none other than Gerry Coleman.

To me Gerry was my choir director for just a few months as a freshman at Concordia College New York. But I entered his life during what would be his final months teaching at Concordia. The man that I met was a complicated man, a man who was clearly struggling but who was too closed off to tell anyone in his professional circle that he needed help. A man who was getting caught in a web of lies and who would eventually have to leave his position with the college. But to me, Gerry was a giant who people adored but I struggled with. Instead, to me Gerry was a man who often wouldn't listen to me, a man who had me singing



musical parts that were out of my vocal range, yet he would smile and say that I would get used to it. Little did he know that I would often spend most evenings drinking tea for hours just to sooth my vocal cords.

And so, when I got news of his passing, I felt this mix of emotions. I know who this man was to so many other people, and I know that his compositions and hymns have often formed and informed my faith. But my grief for him is complicated. Even though so often I have found comfort and strength in the words of his songs about Jesus. In one of Gerry's hymns, he writes "Christ is with me everywhere I go. Never to leave me, this I know." Still in another, an arrangement of the folk hymn, "How can I keep from Singing," I memorized words that have walked with me ever since...

No storm can shake my inmost calm, While to that rock I'm clinging. Since love is lord of heaven and earth How can I keep from singing?

Since Love is lord of heaven and earth, Love... Huh. Here is a man who though his life, through his teaching, and especially through his music, focused in on the Love of God. The love of God which is made manifest through our Lord and Savior Jesus. God's love in human form that loves us enough to suffer for us, loves us enough to die in our place and loves us enough to rise again and give us the promise of hope and life forever with him. And yet I struggled with this man. You see Gerry for all his faults, even in one of the most unfortunate seasons of his life, the season in which I got to know him personally, still always knew this. No storm could shake that calm in him.

So, as I remember Gerry, I remember that November is the month for the church to be thankful for what God has done, what God is doing and what God will do through his church and through all his children.

It all starts on November 1st and November 5th, With our All Saints Day celebrations. On November 5th we will have our All Saints Day celebration, and we will honor those who have gone before us in faith. As we do so, I will have a Candle for Gerry. I will honor the reality that God gave this man, this gentle giant, a creative heart and mind to lead others in singing praises to him. And I will remember and I will honor the complicated relationship I had with this Giant in the church who crossed my path for a period of about 12 months. I will give thanks to God for every single one of those complicated days, because even in those days, God was teaching me a valuable lesson, one I hope to share with you now.

Every Single Saint, every single Christian, every single child of God is complicated. I am, you are, Gerry was, our parents and grandparents were, heck even Saint Peter and Saint Paul were complicated men. None of us have been perfect, none of us have gotten through life without one or two seasons that others might consider unfortunate. We may even have people who will one day hear of our passing, and pause and consider the complexities of their relationship with us before giving thanks to God for all we were and all we are.

We are all complicated saints, and yet our God loves us anyway. He cares for each one of his children, he has compassion over every season of our lives, even the days we wish we could forget. After all this perfect love made manifest, this babe of Bethlehem is the Lamb. The lamb who...

Sighs, dies, He takes my sin and wretchedness. He lives, forgives, He gives me His own Righteousness. Worthy is the Lamb, whose death makes me His own! The Lamb is reigning on His throne!

He Rose, He Rose, my heart with thanks now overflows. His song, prolong, till every heart to Him belong.

This month, let's celebrate and give thanks for all the saints, all those complicated messy children of God, every single one of us, who every has been, is, or will be. And as we do, I pray that we won't just remember their faith, but that most of all, we will remember what Christ has done for them and for us knowing that "Christ is with me, everywhere I go, Never to leave me... Never to leave me... Never to leave you... Never to leave Gerry... Never to leave any of those who are now at rest in Christ Jesus, those who we love and miss, may we know this, always.

Amen.
