AS WE GATHER

Why did God have to use shepherds as the model for ministering to His people? Shepherds are lonely. Shepherds get tired and worn-down as they suffer disappointments and get bowled-over. But, despite all this, shepherds know the deepest joys when every sheep is fed, rescued, and healed on their watch! Years ago on Christmas Night, shepherds thought it was just a normal chilly night until the hills around them echoed the singing of the angels announcing the Savior's birth. The Angels taught that song to the shepherds, who returned to their flocks spreading the good news. Today, we are all called to shepherd as God uses us to make His presence real, when and where no other help can breathe God's breath into a hard place, into a cold winter's night that is still so deep.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: On the Night of our Shepherd's Birth, Angels announced Peace to all the earth to lowly shepherds laying in the field, watching over their sheep.

People: Yet so often we are not people of peace. We seek our way over your way, and get caught up in the business of life.

Pastor: That night the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." Afterward the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

People: Yet so often we stay comfortable, we do not go to the places where your spirit moves and we fail to lead and guide others into your way of peace.

Pastor: Heavenly Father, We confess our sins, our short comings and our failures to you.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

People: Good Shepherd, we have often failed to follow you and have even struggled to care for all that you bring close to us, we have not protected those who are threatened, welcomed those who feel rejected, forgiven those burdened by guilt, or worked to bring healing to those who are sick and broken. We don't always share how you have blessed us with those who have little or nothing, and in this busy time of year we have not taken the time to really know one another and love as you

have loved us. Forgive us Good Shepherd, and teach us to follow you to spread compassion to those near and to those who are far away, to speak for those who are voiceless, to defend those who are oppressed and abused, to work for justice and peace for those who suffer violence, to take the time as we celebrate your birth to recognize our connectedness and to love as you have loved us.

Pastor: Jesus, Our Good Shepherd, reminds us today that “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.” Our sins, all of our mistakes, all the ways we have failed to be undershepherd of the Good Shepherd at Christmas and throughout the year are forgiven in the name of the father, the + Son, and the Holy Spirit, as his forgiveness brings us peace, light and life once again.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Pastor: We gather in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. God has brought us together as many people, from many places, and who have many different past experiences. And yet as we gather together, we are united.

People For Christ is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility,

Pastor: By abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations.

People: His purpose was to create one people out of many, thus making peace.

(The first and second blue candles are lit.)

Pastor: And in this one body to restore the relationship of all to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility.

People: He came and preached peace to those who were far away and to those who were near. For through him we all have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Pastor: And so we celebrate the Prince of Peace and Sing:

OLD TESTAMENT READING

2 Kings 2:1-15

2 Now when the LORD was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. ² And Elijah said to Elisha, "Please stay here, for the LORD has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel. ³ And the sons of the prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that today the LORD will take away your master from over you?" And he said, "Yes, I know it; keep quiet."

⁴ Elijah said to him, "Elisha, please stay here, for the LORD has sent me to Jericho." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So they came to Jericho. ⁵ The sons of the prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know

that today the LORD will take away your master from over you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know it; keep quiet."

⁶ Then Elijah said to him, "Please stay here, for the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. ⁷ Fifty men of the sons of the prophets also went and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. ⁸ Then Elijah took his cloak and rolled it up and struck the water, and the water was parted to the one side and to the other, till the two of them could go over on dry ground.

⁹ When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask what I shall do for you, before I am taken from you." And Elisha said, "Please let there be a double portion of your spirit on me." ¹⁰ And he said, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it shall be so for you, but if you do not see me, it shall not be so." ¹¹ And as they still went on and talked, behold, chariots of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them. And Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven. ¹² And Elisha saw it and he cried, "My father, my father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" And he saw him no more.

Then he took hold of his own clothes and tore them in two pieces. ¹³ And he took up the cloak of Elijah that had fallen from him and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. ¹⁴ Then he took the cloak of Elijah that had fallen from him and struck the water, saying, "Where is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" And when he had struck the water, the water was parted to the one side and to the other, and Elisha went over. ¹⁵ Now when the sons of the prophets who were at Jericho saw him opposite them, they said, "The spirit of Elijah rests on Elisha." And they came to meet him and bowed to the ground before him.

2 Timothy 1:1-14

1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God according to the promise of the life that is in Christ Jesus,

² To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

³ I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴ As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with joy. ⁵ I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. ⁶ For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, ⁷ for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

⁸ Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ and which now has been manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, ¹¹ for which I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, ¹² which is why I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me. ¹³ Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ By the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, guard the good deposit entrusted to you.
