To Give His Life.

As We Gather

For the third time in three chapters, Jesus announced clearly and directly His impending rejection, condemnation, suffering, and death. This time the silence was as uncomfortable as the announcement, so two of the disciples did what all of us do, they changed the subject. When we change the subject too quickly from the ugliness of the cross to its beauty, or from suffering to glory (as James and John tried to do), problems arise. We need to call the cross what it is: Terrible, awful, and tragic. But in that terrible, awful and tragic thing, we find Hope. Jesus' resurrection means our own. We too who suffer for a little while (see 1 Peter 5:10), will rise from the dead and live under Jesus in His Kingdom for all eternity. On that day there will never again be any need to change the subject ever again.

HOLY COMMUNION. . . OUR UNDERSTANDING

It is the special joy of the baptized and instructed Christian to celebrate Christ in our very midst with the Sacrament of the Altar (Holy Communion). The Scripture clearly and carefully teaches that, in Holy Communion, the very Body and the very Blood of our Lord Jesus are really present in, with, and under the forms of bread and wine. It also teaches that "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord (acknowledging the Real Presence of Jesus with the elements) eats and drinks judgment on himself." (I Corinthians 11:28-29).

Communicants, then, are rightfully prepared and "worthy" when they:

- are truly penitent of their sins;
- even now embrace Jesus as their Savior and recognize His Real Presence in the bread and the wine; and
- seek to amend their sinful lives, with the assistance of this Meal and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Other notes on the distribution of Holy Communion:

- 1) Wine is the Biblical standard for all communicants. However, grape juice is in some glasses and available in the <u>center</u> of each tray for those who have an intolerance to alcohol.
- 2) The Blood of Christ, in, with and under the wine, is served in individual glasses.
- 3) Children and adults not instructed or confirmed are still encouraged to approach The Table to receive a blessing.
