Peace Given to Believe.

AS WE GATHER

There's something about showing off scars. In 1989, the legendary motorcycle stuntman Evel Knievel was caught in a lawsuit over his scars. In court, the police officer stated that he had not seen any scars, which annoyed Knievel so much he asked if he could "take my shirt off right now..." saying "These scars can be seen from here to the door!" Scars legitimize experience. They remind us of the past but they also remind us of the future. A future we hope will be more meaningful and perhaps stronger with those scars. So it is with Jesus. Thomas tells the other disciples, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." Thomas gets his wish. Eight days later, Jesus appears to Thomas, saying,

"Put your finger here and see my hands, and put out your hand and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve but believe." Why does Jesus still have his scars? What if his scars are left on purpose? To emphasize the beauty of Jesus through his work to save the lost and raise the dead? Jesus' scars proclaim the truth that we broken sinners now belong to him forever.

HOLY COMMUNION...OUR UNDERSTANDING

It is the special joy of the baptized and instructed Christian to celebrate Christ in our very midst with the Sacrament of the Altar (Holy Communion). The Scripture clearly and carefully teaches that, in Holy Communion, the very Body and the very Blood of our Lord Jesus are really present in, with, and under the forms of bread and wine. It also teaches that "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord (acknowledging the Real Presence of Jesus with the elements) eats and drinks judgment on himself." (I Corinthians 11:28-29).

Communicants, then, are rightfully prepared and "worthy" when they:

- are truly penitent of their sins;
- even now embrace Jesus as their Savior and recognize His Real Presence in the bread and the wine; and
- seek to amend their sinful lives, with the assistance of this Meal and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Other notes on the distribution of Holy Communion:

- 1) Wine is the Biblical standard for all communicants. However, grape juice is in some glasses and available in the <u>center</u> of each tray for those who have an intolerance to alcohol.
- 2) The Blood of Christ, in, with and under the wine, <u>is served in individual</u> glasses.
- 3) Children and adults not instructed or confirmed are still encouraged to approach The Table to receive a blessing.
