NEWS FROM THE JANUARY COUNCIL MEETING

Pastor Tim's report:

One year has ended and a new one has begun, and as we look forward into 2025, I want to focus on the realities of three words that must, must be the heartbeat of our congregation in 2025: “Grieve, Grow, GO!” I believe that if we hold all these words in the tension they deserve to be held in, 2025 will be a great year for us here at Beautiful Savior.

Christian Education:

- **Sunday morning Bible class will study Isaiah and continues to meet at 8:30 am.**
- **Brunch and Bibles will meet Wednesdays, Feb. 12 and Feb. 26 at noon at Crackers&Co. to study Romans.**
- **Wednesday in the Word will meet Feb. 5 and 19 at 7 pm to study Genesis.**
- **Three episodes are left in season 4 of The Chosen. They will meet Feb.12 and 26. We will pause to wait for the new season and will schedule meetings after Easter.**
- **We plan to be more intentional with offering Sunday School every week. I am looking for people to serve as aides to assist the leader each week.**

Community Events:

The Easter Egg hunt needs to be scheduled. I am looking for a co-chair to help plan this event and recruit volunteers.

Pastor's Schedule:

I plan to be at the Best Practices in Ministry event Feb. 13-15 at Christ Church Lutheran. My next PLI training is April 2-5 in California.

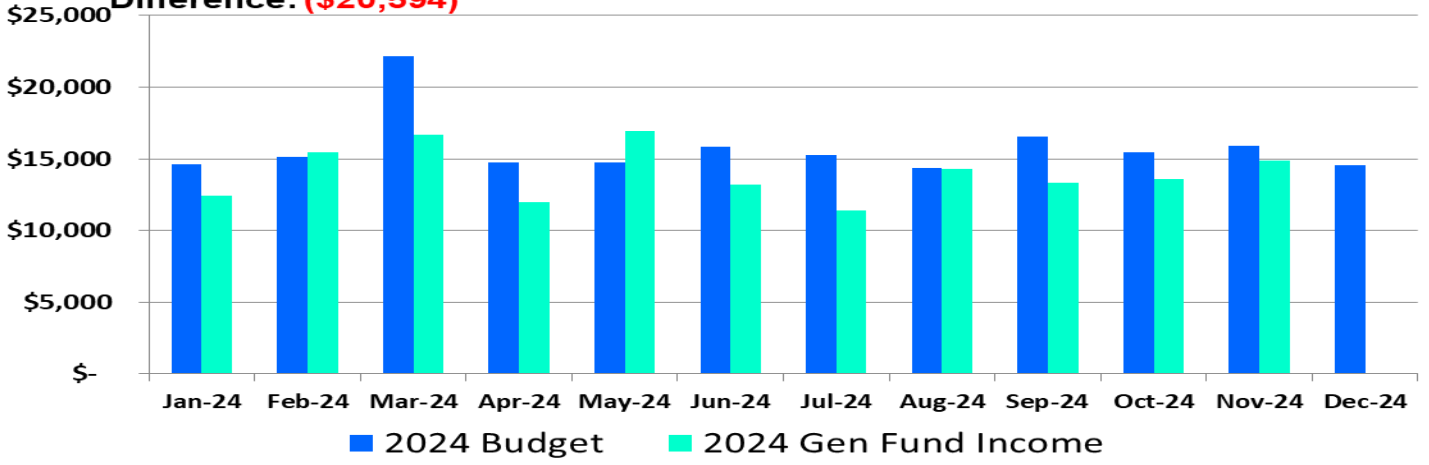

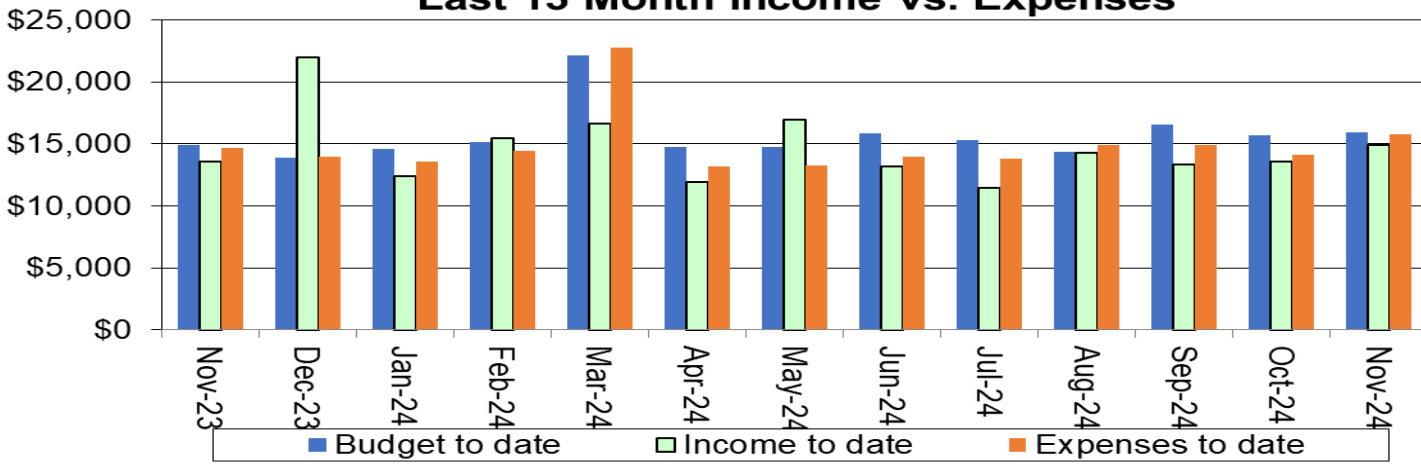

Difference: **(\$20,594)**

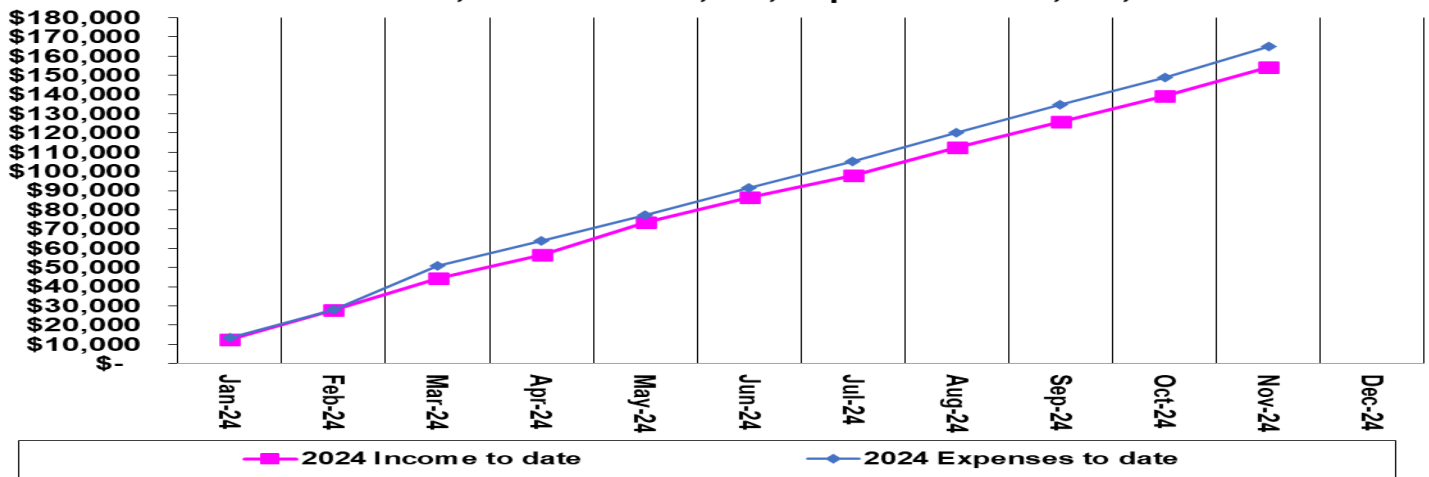


Last 13 Month Income vs. Expenses

As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others.

LWML Monday Bible Study continues with 6 to 8 in attendance. We are studying men of the Bible and learning more details about their stories and their faith. All BSLC women and friends are invited to attend.

The LWML District Retreat was held in Phoenix Jan. 24-26, 2025. Two members from BSLC attended joining the other 90 attendees to rest and "Rejoice in Hope and Joy". Dr. Kari Vo of Lutheran Hour Ministries described her Christian life journey and work with in Vietnamese husband serving the St. Louis Vietnamese community. Bible study leader was Debbie Okubo leading us to "Experience the Joy Then Share It". Our mission service project was to create 150 prayer books of verses of comfort and joy. La Mesa Financial Management Ministry

Did you know that your finances are a gift from God? This is true if we're a millionaire, a billionaire, or if we are homeless and collecting a government assistance check. God blesses each of us uniquely. He wants us to be thankful for all His gifts, and to manage them wisely for His glory. However, we often find ourselves at the end of each month with very little money left, and we struggle to make it to the next paycheck. Other times we experience a financial emergency and find ourselves borrowing money or resorting to credit cards to cover the cost, and we convince ourselves that we'll pay it back "next month."

If you have been in this downward cycle of spending and debt, and you're sick and tired of it, you are not alone. Even though our finances may be modest, we've got to avoid the poor decisions we've made in the past and develop a plan to achieve financial peace in our lives. If we want a different result, we've got to change what we're doing.

LaMesa Ministries offers a Financial Management class, which is loosely based on Dave Ramsey's "Financial Peace University" curriculum. This class has 4 lessons held on Thursday evenings at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church in Tempe from 5:30pm to 7:00pm:

- Building a Solid Foundation
- Developing a Monthly Balanced Budget
- Saving for Emergencies
- Avoiding Debt

- - **"It's all in the Name!"**
 - Rev. Timothy Anderson
- Last month, it was a joy for me to bring in our Pacific Southwest District's Ministry Executive, Rev. Jim Henkell to talk to us about ways to move ministry forward in 2025 and beyond here at Beautiful Savior. But I must be honest about something with all of you, I really didn't know what to expect or what Jim might share with all of us. I had sat with him back in October to begin dreaming about what a conversation might look like, but I had no idea that he would bring us back to basics. But I am so glad he did.
- As Rev. Henkell led our conversation, he started with an old church rhyme that I have heard again and again since I was a kid, I can even still do the hand motions...

- **“Here is the Church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people.”**
- What I did not expect was for Rev. Henkell to take that familiar rhyme and redefine it for us. I did not expect him to pull it apart and ask us to really reflect on some hard truths and realities about our congregation. Our strengths, our weaknesses, our mission, our ministry and especially the ways that we might even be the stumbling block to people drawing closer to Jesus and his kingdom.
- But what I saw was lively conversation happening all over the room, and as your Pastor, I am so proud of all of you who were a part of the conversation. I am proud of us. Proud of the work we did and the honest conversations we had. As Rev. Henkell and I have continued to talk through what you shared with one another and shared with us, there are a few things to highlight.
- Our mission statement, “Serve the Lord, extend the Gospel, and make Jesus alive in the community.” has served us as a congregation for many years; but the truth is, not all of us know it, and it seems to have a limited impact in expressing our identity as a church or in driving our activity. It might be time for a new statement that better reflects who we are, what we are about and what we want to be about.
- Also, though Rev. Henkell’s conversations with us, we learned what we believe to be true about ourselves. We believe that as a church we value a genuine sense of togetherness and care. We also believe that we are friendly and generous. We learned that we believe we express sensitivity to those with special needs or unique circumstances. We learned that we prioritize traditional worship with winsome expressions and applicable messages. We learned that we believe that we exist within a diverse community of older adults, young families, and college students as we host numerous community events, including those for unhoused and underserved people, animal lovers, pet parents and as many other neighbors as we can.
- But there were also some hard truths that we admitted as we talked. We admitted to one another that at times, Beautiful Savior attempts to do or be too many things. That often the activities and events we offer do not develop the relationships that are needed to continue our ministry into the future. We admitted to ourselves and one another that we have had a greater focus on community outreach than on personal witness. We also talked about how even though we see ourselves as friendly and generous, sometimes we can be too comfortable, the word cliquish was even mentioned. As a church we are worried about our long-

term viability as we serve a community that seems to have high turnover and low engagement, at least that's what we have perceived from our neighborhood lately.

- So, what do we do? How do we serve this complex community, how do we play our role in the kingdom of God as we bring about that spirit of togetherness and care of one another into our community and world and personally proclaim Jesus to one another and the people God has placed in our lives. Where do we fit? Who is God calling us to be?
- What if the answer to that question has been imbedded in our identity from the start. What if I told you that Rev. Henkell and I honestly believe that it's all in the name. As the two of us have been talking, we just kept thinking about our name... "Beautiful Savior." As we pondered it, I was drawn back to the hymn.
- ***Beautiful Savior, King of Creation, Son of God and Son of Man! Truly I'd love Thee, Truly I'd serve Thee, Light of my soul, my joy, my crown.***
- ***Fair are the meadows, fair are the woodlands, Robed in flow'rs of blooming spring; Jesus is fairer, Jesus is purer, He makes our Sorrowing spirit sing.***
- The hymn of course continues, but for our sake I want to focus on the first two stanzas. Truly I'd love thee, I'd serve thee because Jesus is the light of our soul, he is our joy, he is our crown, he is fairer, purer, than the best things in creation and he makes our sorrowing spirit sing. Jesus knows all of life, the WHOLE thing, the best days and the worst days, and yet he makes each day Beautiful. Because that's who he is and that is what he declares us, his people to be. Beautiful. It's almost like Jesus is looking at our church as we have toiled and toiled to figure ourselves out and said, "it's right there, in your name! You are Beautiful Savior, remind the world how beautiful life can be when I am in it."
- As such, consider these words... Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church is a church that is constantly ***"Discovering and sharing the beauty of Jesus' love throughout our whole lives."*** Also, when we say "Whole" it can refer to each season of our lives, as well as the wholeness of heart, mind, and soul. As a church then we would build our ministry and our ministry plan around "Discovering the Beauty and Sharing the Beauty"
- We would **"Discover The Beauty"** in our worship, our preaching, our study, our prayer, and other ministries designed to see God's beauty in our life as we care for ourselves and one another mentally, physically and emotionally.
- We would **"Share The Beauty"** in our personal Witness as we teach and learn how to share our faith with those God has given us in this life; namely our family, friends

and neighbors. Learning to speak faith into our personal relationships must be a focus of our ministry moving forward. We also learn to be more strategic in our outreach events so that we can not only serve the community but initiate relationships with participants. Finally, we want to grow our partnerships. We have to. This building was not built to ever sit empty. Honestly it's a waste of a resource if we allow that. We should look to partner with more organizations, groups like AA, celebrate recovery, grief share, divorce care groups, counseling centers, our ASU ministries, senior care and more. God will show us the way to reflect his Beauty.

- I know that is a lot to share this month, but please pray on it, and talk to each other and me about it. I especially want to ask you to pray over this new potential mission statement again. Pray for your elders and council too as we continue to hear your feedback and talk it through among ourselves as well. This needs to belong to all of us. A mission is nothing if it's just mine, it needs to be ours.

- So, pray over these words. Again... Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church is a church that is constantly ***“Discovering and sharing the beauty of Jesus’ love throughout our whole lives.”*** Listen to the Holy Spirit as you mull them over and ask God is this who he is calling our church to be. I can wait to hear what the spirit stirs up in you as you think about who God is calling us to be in 2025 and beyond.

- Also, though Rev. Henkell’s conversations with us, we learned what we believe to be true about ourselves. We believe that as a church we value a genuine sense of togetherness and care. We also believe that we are friendly and generous. We learned that we believe we express sensitivity to those with special needs or unique circumstances. We learned that we prioritize traditional worship with winsome expressions and applicable messages. We learned that we believe that we exist within a diverse community of older adults, young families, and college students as we host numerous community events, including those for unhoused and underserved people, animal lovers, pet parents and as many other neighbors as we can.
- But there were also some hard truths that we admitted as we talked. We admitted to one another that at times, Beautiful Savior attempts to do or be too many things. That often the activities and events we offer do not develop the relationships that are needed to continue our ministry into the future. We admitted to ourselves and one another that we have had a greater focus on community outreach than on personal witness. We also talked about how even though we see ourselves as friendly and generous, sometimes we can be too comfortable, the word cliquish was even mentioned. As a church we are worried about our long-term viability as we serve a community that seems to have high turnover and low engagement, at least that’s what we have perceived from our neighborhood lately.
- So, what do we do? How do we serve this complex community, how do we play our role in the kingdom of God as we bring about that spirit of togetherness and care of one another into our community and world and personally proclaim Jesus to one another and the people God has placed in our lives. Where do we fit? Who is God calling us to be?
- What if the answer to that question has been imbedded in our identity from the start. What if I told you that Rev. Henkell and I honestly believe that it’s all in the name. As the two of us have been talking, we just kept thinking about our name... “Beautiful Savior.” As we pondered it, I was drawn back to the hymn.
- ***Beautiful Savior, King of Creation, Son of God and Son of Man! Truly I’d love Thee, Truly I’d serve Thee, Light of my soul, my joy, my crown.***
- ***Fair are the meadows, fair are the woodlands, Robed in flow’rs of blooming spring; Jesus is fairer, Jesus is purer, He makes our Sorrowing spirit sing.***
- The hymn of course continues, but for our sake I want to focus on the first two stanzas. Truly I’d love thee, I’d serve thee because Jesus is the light of our soul, he is our joy, he is our crown, he is fairer, purer, than the best things in creation and he makes our sorrowing spirit sing. Jesus knows all of life, the WHOLE thing, the best days and the worst days, and yet he makes each day Beautiful. Because that’s who he is and that is what he declares us, his people to be. Beautiful. Its almost like Jesus is looking at our church as we have toiled and toiled to figure ourselves out and said, “its right there, in your name! You are Beautiful Savior, remind the world how beautiful life can be when I am in it.”

- As such, consider these words... Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church is a church that is constantly ***“Discovering and sharing the beauty of Jesus’ love throughout our whole lives.”*** Also, when we say “Whole” it can refer to each season of our lives, as well as the wholeness of heart, mind, and soul. As a church then we would build our ministry and our ministry plan around “Discovering the Beauty and Sharing the Beauty”
- We would **“Discover The Beauty”** in our worship, our preaching, our study, our prayer, and other ministries designed to see God’s beauty in our life as we care for ourselves and one another mentally, physically and emotionally.
- We would **“Share The Beauty”** in our personal Witness as we teach and learn how to share our faith with those God has given us in this life; namely our family, friends and neighbors. Learning to speak faith into our personal relationships must be a focus of our ministry moving forward. We also learn to be more strategic in our outreach events so that we can not only serve the community but initiate relationships with participants. Finally, we want to grow our partnerships. We have to. This building was not built to ever sit empty. Honestly it’s a waste of a resource if we allow that. We should look to partner with more organizations, groups like AA, celebrate recovery, grief share, divorce care groups, counseling centers, our ASU ministries, senior care and more. God will show us the way to reflect his Beauty.
- I know that is a lot to share this month, but please pray on it, and talk to each other and me about it. I especially want to ask you to pray over this new potential mission statement again. Pray for your elders and council too as we continue to hear your feedback and talk it through among ourselves as well. This needs to belong to all of us. A mission is nothing if it’s just mine, it needs to be ours.
- So, pray over these words. Again... Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church is a church that is constantly ***“Discovering and sharing the beauty of Jesus’ love throughout our whole lives.”*** Listen to the Holy Spirit as you mull them over and ask God is this who he is calling our church to be. I can wait to hear what the spirit stirs up in you as you think about who God is calling us to be in 2025 and beyond.
